Team description

Job purpose

The Education Engagement Officer is a member of the Community, Events and Education team, which leads on the engagement and development of relationships with individuals and community organisations. The role plays a key part in the team's delivery of the Mass Engagement department strategy.

The Education Engagement Officer works closely with the Education Specialist, the Youth Engagement Manager, and the Water Industry Partnership team to deliver a range of engagement opportunities, products and resources.



The post holder plays a role in developing our relationships with Water Industry partners and their customers, schools, and youth groups with the aim of maximising engagement opportunities around global water and sanitation issues.

Accountabilities

- Creating engaging content for projects and special activities that meet the shared objectives of WaterAid and Water Industry partners.
- Creating and developing educational resources for visitors, schools, families and special interest groups that visit Water Industry Education Centres.
- Developing lesson plans and schools resources in collaboration with the Education Specialist.
- Building engagement opportunities, including working with developers, designers, creative agencies and associated suppliers.
- Delivering talks, workshops and activities in partnership with schools and youth groups.

Outreach

- Meeting with and delivering presentations to a range of audiences, from meetings with Water Industry partners and educators to informal meetings with groups of children and young people.
- Developing engagement plans in collaboration with Water Industry colleagues and the Education Specialist.
- Delivering the Challenge: Water Education Engagement Programme.
- Representing WaterAid in relevant external fora to ensure that WaterAid is, and is seen to be, at the forefront of education and youth engagement.
- Delivering "train the trainer" sessions to broaden the reach of our workshops and activities.

Development

- Using the Youth Engagement strategy to engage the public in line with WaterAid's 2030 Everyone, Everywhere objective.
- Keeping up- to-date with relevant changes in Water Industry programmes and government initiatives and recommending future approaches to support and benefit from these changes.
- Developing activities and workshops in response to particular themes from Water Industry partners and schools that share the messages of WaterAid.
