Stakeholder Engagement Postdoctoral Associate Human Right to Water in California

The Woods Institute for the Environment at Stanford University invites applications for a **Stakeholder Engagement Postdoctoral Associate**. This position is part of a new, collaborative research initiative on **advancing the human right to water in California**. It is funded by the recently launched <u>Sustainability Accelerator</u> in the new <u>Stanford Doerr School of Sustainability</u>. The postdoctoral associate will work with <u>Prof. Sarah Fletcher</u>, <u>Prof. Jenna Davis</u>, <u>Prof. Buzz Thompson</u>, and <u>Prof. Khalid Osman</u>.

Over one million people in California lack consistent access to adequate quantities of safe water. In 2012 CA became the first state to pass a law recognizing the human right to water, defined by three pillars: accessibility, quality, and affordability. The associate will explore opportunities to co-create research with external partners to address barriers to implementation including: metric design, data collection and management, and decision-support. This position is ideal for a recent PhD seeking to transition from academia to the public or non-profit sectors. This is a 9-12 month position with possible extension seeking a summer or fall 2022 start date.

Key Responsibilities:

- Data collection and review of relevant policies, regulation, research, and implementation efforts towards the HR2W in CA
- Map and engage key HR2W stakeholders, including representatives of disadvantaged communities, to understand their interests and concerns
- Plan and organize a workshop to convene individuals and organizations who are supporting implementation of the human right to water in CA
- Identify knowledge and implementation gaps where Stanford researchers can meaningfully contribute to advance the HR2W
- Support proposal development in partnership with stakeholder organizations for follow-on funding to co-develop research and solutions

- Experience with stakeholder engagement and outreach; community engagement experience preferred
