TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR CONSULTANTS

1. BACKGROUND / RATIONALE:

In Tamil Nadu and Kerala, UN ORGANISATION supports state-specific programs aligned with national initiatives like Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM), Swachh Bharat (urban and rural), and Climate Change and Environmental Sustainability (CCES). These focus on children's rights and a healthy environment. The Chennai Field Office advocates for climate resilience across these programs and leads capacity building for Rural WASH Partners as directed by the Ministry of Jal Shakti. It also promotes climate-resilient interventions.

Both states aim to provide piped water to every home under JJM, with UN ORGANISATION supporting through technical guidelines, capacity building, community engagement, and monitoring frameworks. As of mid-October 2024, 72% of Tamil Nadu and 99% of Kerala villages are validated; 53% and 95% of model villages are confirmed. Household tap coverage is 87% in Tamil Nadu, 54% in Kerala, below the 79% national average. In Kerala, 81% of water sources are bacterially contaminated, and 9.3% chemically.

WASH gaps remain. Sanitation coverage is 72.6% in Tamil Nadu and 98.7% in Kerala (NFHS-5). Latrine usage is 67.2% in Tamil Nadu and 99.6% in Kerala (NSSO). Kerala has 55.2% improved

drinking water sources (NSSO). FSM site selection and implementation remain challenging in Kerala.

Both states face climate risks—cyclones, floods, droughts. Kerala has six districts under drought, two with thunderstorms, five with floods, and nine with heavy rainfall. Such events disproportionately affect women, children, and persons with disabilities. Reopening of schools, post-disaster requires multi-sectoral coordination between SDMA, education, WASH, and health. Climate-resilient policies are yet to be implemented. Youth and child involvement in WASH and CCES is vital for statewide impact. UN ORGANISATION provides technical expertise for planning, implementing, and monitoring SBM-G and JJM, and supports advocacy for climate-resilient programs.

2. PURPOSE OF ASSIGNMENT

The purpose of this TOR is to hire a Technical Expert who will support the UN ORGANISATION in Chennai Tamil Nadu in providing technical assistance to key line departments (Rural Development & Panchayati Raj, Climate Change and Environment, Local Self Government Department, Water Authority, Department of Health, Public Health and Engineering Department, Department of Education) in the two states of Tamil Nadu and Kerala, to strengthen the roll-out of the outline programmes for the purpose of achieving the established goals within the agreed upon timeframes. The consultant will contribute to operationalizing state / districts plan at all levels for the relevant programmes and support policy level decisions / documents and support complementary efforts to promote long-lasting behaviour change and community buy-in through social and behaviour change campaigns and interventions.
