Project Background

The Pacific region is increasingly vulnerable to the impacts of climate change, environmental degradation, and natural hazards—placing a disproportionate burden on children and their communities. In the North Pacific, the Republic of Palau, the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM), and the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI) are facing rising threats to food and water security, greater exposure to climate-sensitive diseases, and disruption of essential services such as health and education. To address these challenges, UNICEF Pacific has launched the Climate Resilient WASH



















and Nutrition Programme, a two-year initiative from September 2025 to September 2027, aimed at strengthening the resilience of communities and ensuring the health and wellbeing of children in the region. This cross-sectoral programme focuses on two key determinants of child health-Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) and Nutrition—through the following components: 1) Promoting safe drinking water through the development and implementation of Drinking Water Safety training in schools and/or communities in Palau; 2) Enhancing drought preparedness through the piloting of climate-resilient WASH technologies, including remote water monitoring systems in FSM and RMI; 3) Supporting healthy child diets by increasing access to local, nutritious food through caregiver training, school/community gardening, and growth monitoring in Palau. The programme emphasizes capacity development at all levels—training teachers, caregivers, youth, and community leaders in water conservation, hygiene, waste management, food production, and health promotion. It fosters practical, community-led solutions that align with national policies and education standards, and promotes sustainability through peer learning, school-based competitions, and long-term planning. UNICEF is seeking partnerships with qualified organizations—including NGOs, academic institutions, and community-based organizations—with relevant experience in WASH, nutrition, education, and climate resilience. Interested partners will play a central role in delivering integrated services across Palau, FSM, and RMI, and in building the systems and skills needed to create lasting impact.

Expected Results

The Climate Resilient WASH and Nutrition Programme aims to achieve measurable, community-driven improvements in water, sanitation, hygiene, and nutrition across Palau, the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM), and the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI). Partners selected through this Expression of Interest will be expected to contribute to the following results: 1. Improved Water Safety and Hygiene Practices in Schools and Communities (Palau) - Development and implementation of at least 4 Drinking Water Safety training in schools and/or communities. - 100 community members and 200 students trained on safe water practices, low-cost water treatment, and hygiene promotion (including handwashing and menstrual hygiene). - Establishment of 4 school and/or community WASH action plans with implementation support. - Delivery of at least 4 awareness-raising campaigns on water safety and climate adaptation. 2. Strengthened Community Resilience to Drought (FSM and RMI) - Installation of 10 remote water monitoring systems in vulnerable communities. - Training of 700 community members (male and female) in water conservation and drought adaptation. 3. Healthier Child Diets and Improved Nutrition Practices (Palau) - Implementation of 4 community and/or school based training programs on nutritious food preparation using local ingredients. - Participation of 100 caregivers and 200 students in school gardening, food processing, and healthy cooking activities. - Organization of 4 cooking challenges to promote the use of diverse, local foods and increase awareness of healthy diets. - Monitor child nutrition status in at least 4 sites/community. - Production and distribution of user-friendly technical materials (e.g., manuals, posters, videos) on water safety, food safety, hygiene, gardening, and nutrition.
