Project Background

As per the Joint Response Plan (JRP) for 2025, the Government of Bangladesh (GoB) projected the relocation of 40,000 Rohingya refugees to Bhasan Char. By July 2025, a total of 37,039 Rohingya refugees — including 20,542 Children (aged 0-18 years) in Bhasan Char. Children and adolescents there continue to face significant risks due to unsafe water, poor sanitation, and inadequate hygiene practices. To address this, ongoing hygiene promotion coupled with water treatment is crucial at both the source and household levels. Regular maintenance of latrines and bathing facilities is vital for the Rohingya community. Since these facilities are older than 6 years, a higher frequency of repair and maintenance is required to keep them functional. Faecal sludge management is a challenge as wastewater from 250 digesters is discharged directly into drains, risking water contamination. The biogas outlets in BC frequently face blockages from various materials, including menstrual pads and other small particles. Moreover, the quantity of daily collected waste is still low due to the disposal of waste in open drains, resulting in blockages, restricting water flow and

















ideal breeding conditions for mosquitoes, especially during the monsoon. On the other hand, limited awareness of proper MHM practices coupled with myths, misconceptions and limited access to essential menstrual hygiene commodities is creating a concerning situation for girls and women of reproductive age. Menstrual hygiene management (MHM) and other hygiene practices are also challenging Additionally, climate change risks are also intensifying in BC, and particularly during the monsoon season, flooding and other disasters create more difficulties for WASH intervention in addressing critical needs. The selected Partner will be responsible for implementing all of the WASH interventions outlined in this Expression of Interest, which includes the management of UNICEF AoR Clusters. These interventions contribute to the achievement of the Bhasan Char Joint Response Plan (JRP) 2026 objectives for the WASH Sector. The selected partner is expected to work in partnership with the WASH Sector, providing capacity building support to other WASH Sector partners and in line with guidance given by the WASH Sector Lead, CiC, and the Additional Refugee Relief and Repatriation Commissioner (ARRRC). Community Maintenance Team (CMT) will be used to reduce cost of O&M; of WASH services. Targeted and mainstreamed community engagement needs to follow an approach that prevents and responds on WASH concerns at the family and community level, and which shares information with communities to make informed choices regarding WASH services. Community members' voices need to be heard and responded to for greater accountability and inclusive WASH programme delivery. Privacy concerns for women, girls and persons with Disabilities. In accordance with UNICEF's due diligence requirements, partners with an established history of partnerships with UNICEF, who have demonstrated progressive improvements in compliance areas including Protection from Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA), Child safeguarding, fraud prevention, organizational governance, and procurement practices validated through audits, spot checks, and monitoring visits, will be accorded priority consideration in selection under the CFEI process.

Expected Results

The partner must have technical experience in Water Quality monitoring, Solid Waste Management, Fecal Sludge Management and vector control, technical capacity to lead the different technical working groups with the staff capacity development for effective WASH services delivery. The partner should be able to provide technical skills programming for the Person with Disabilities (PWD). The organization must have approval to work in Bhasan Char
