A. BACKGROUND

The Swiss-funded *Groundwater Management, Use and Protection Programme (GWP)* aims at supporting North Macedonia in establishing a sustainable long-term, multi-level, and systematic groundwater management that enables collaborative, effective, and more transparent use of the groundwater resources.

The GWP stakeholders/partners include institutions at central governmental level, research and academia as well as local institutions (e.g. municipalities, public utilities), civil society organisations and the private sector. The **consortium of Skat Consulting and PointPro Consulting** has been mandated by the **Swiss Embassy** in the Republic of North Macedonia to implement Phase 1 of the GWP from Jan 2024 – Dec 2027. Two additional subsequent phases may follow subject to successful implementation of the Programme's first phase and fulfilment of the overall commitment of its main national partners.

Groundwater Management, Use and Protection Programme (GWP) aims to increase the effectiveness of the legal framework by supporting the drafting of amendments to existing laws and regulations. This is all about creating an enabling environment with appropriate policies, strategies and laws for the management, use and protection of groundwater. Increasing legal effectiveness will be achieved by supporting the harmonisation of the national legislation with the objectives of the relevant EU directives and by consolidating the existing legal framework. GWP aims to remove some of the main barriers inhibiting better water resources management at different levels in the country, stemming mostly from incomplete and/or inconsistent legal and regulatory frameworks, including different interpretations of laws by key institutions; bottlenecks caused by the current institutional model, including limited capacity of key institutions in terms of access to funding and the required number of staff with certain skills; and limited cooperation between key institutions at technical, policy and education levels.









To create a more efficient legal framework, the Programme will support the development of recommendations and supporting documents to harmonise national legislation in line with the COUNCIL DIRECTIVE 91/676/EEC of 12 December 1991 concerning the protection of waters against pollution caused by nitrates from agricultural sources, as amended by Regulation (EC) 1882/2003 and Regulation (EC) 1137/2008

The COUNCIL DIRECTIVE 91/676/EEC of 12 December 1991 concerning the protection of waters against pollution caused by nitrates from agricultural sources, as amended by Regulation (EC) 1882/2003 and Regulation (EC) 1137/2008 is a crucial component of the EU's environmental legislation aimed at protecting water resources from agricultural pollution. It was established to address the increasing levels of nitrates in water bodies due to agricultural activities. The directive seeks to safeguard both groundwater and surface water from pollution caused by nitrates originating from agricultural sources, such as fertilizers and manure. It encourages the adoption of sustainable farming practices to minimize nitrate runoff and leaching into water systems. Member States are required to designate areas at risk of nitrate pollution as NVZs, where specific regulations and action programs must be implemented to mitigate pollution

The provisions of the Law on Waters (Official Gazette of RM no.87/08, as amended) have ensured partial alignment with the requirements of this Directive and the Rulebook on the criteria for determining the nitrate sensitive zones (Official Gazette of RM no. 131/11). Full transposition was planned by adoption of the secondary legislation pursuant to Law on Waters. Also, the relevant basis for transposition is covered through Law on Livestock (Official Gazette of RM no. 7/08, 116/10 and 23/13), Law on Agriculture and Rural Development (Official Gazette of RM no. 49/10, 53/11, 126/12, 15/13, 69/13, 106/13, 177/14 and 25/15) and the Rulebook on Codes for good agriculture and sanitary practice (Official Gazette of RM no.112/10).

North Macedonia stated that it is partially aligned with the Directive 91/676/EEC concerning the Protection of Waters Against Pollution Caused by Nitrates from Agricultural Sources (Nitrates Directive), through laws and secondary laws. National legislation is fully aligned with some of the Directive's annexes, while only partially with other annexes. North Macedonia intends to align with remaining parts of the Directive with the adoption of the Law on plant nutrition in the second half of 2024. According to the Law on Quality and Safety on Fertilizers, Biostimulators and Improvers of the Soil, 82 samples a year were taken since 2018. Further implementation through further legislative alignment, strengthening of capacities, improving financing and monitoring is foreseen for the period from 2025 to 2030¹.

Although North Macedonia has established a partial legal basis for implementing the Nitrates Directive—through provisions in the Law on Waters, the Rulebook on the criteria for determining nitrate sensitive zones, the Law on Livestock, the Law on Agriculture and Rural Development, and the Rulebook on Codes of Good Agricultural and Sanitary Practice—the majority of key implementation obligations remain unfulfilled in practice. The reasons are multi-layered and stem both from institutional and practical interlinked constraints, and as a result the Directive remains largely unimplemented beyond the initial legal alignment steps. While the Rulebook defines criteria for nitrate-sensitive zones, there is no comprehensive, systematic monitoring programme in place to measure nitrate concentrations in surface and groundwater. No accredited laboratory exists for routine nitrate analysis, which prevents credible data collection and validation of water quality status. Even though criteria have been established, no formal administrative act or government decision has been issued to designate vulnerable zones as required under Article 3 of the Directive. Without this designation, downstream obligations such as establishing action programmes and imposing additional measures—cannot be triggered. Further, the legal framework provides for code of good agricultural practice, but their application remains voluntary and is not systematically promoted or enforced. There is no dedicated inspection protocol or trained inspectorate specifically responsible for verifying compliance with nitrate-related measures. Action programmes tailored to nitrate vulnerable zones

have not been prepared or adopted. Fertilizer application limits and technical standards for manure storage, which are critical obligations under Annex III, have likewise not been set through binding rules or implemented in practice. Implementation requires significant resources, both in terms of budget and qualified staff. Progress has been hampered by limited institutional capacity, fragmented responsibilities among competent authorities, and lack of dedicated funding to establish monitoring, enforcement, and advisory support systems. Some obligations, such as establishing protocols for cooperation with other Member States and reporting to the European Commission, are foreseen to take effect only upon EU accession. However, the lack of baseline data and monitoring capacity already delays readiness for these future requirements. Due to significant institutional constraints, limited nitrate monitoring data, and the absence of accredited laboratories for nitrate or eutrophication analysis, a phased and evidence-based approach is needed.

To close these gaps, few interventions in legal framework are needed. Initially, embedding the Directive's obligations in national laws, which has been partially achieved through the Law on Waters and related acts is necessary, following enacting detailed rulebooks and administrative regulations that operationalize the law, such as specifying designation criteria, monitoring obligations, and good practice codes. Some of these instruments exist, but they are not comprehensive or fully up to date. This crucial step requires implementing acts- formal government decisions to designate nitrate vulnerable zones and formally adopt action programmes. This approach must begin with a strategic recommendation regarding the implementation path under Article 3 of the Directive, and—if applicable—proceed with the scientific delineation of NVZs using a weight-of-evidence approach. In North Macedonia, these decisions have not been issued.

To support above mentioned goals, the GWP Programme is looking for expert to support the further harmonization and alignment of the COUNCIL DIRECTIVE 91/676/EEC of 12 December 1991 concerning the protection of waters against pollution caused by nitrates from agricultural sources, as amended by Regulation (EC) 1882/2003 and Regulation (EC) 1137/2008.

B. SCOPE OF WORK

The aim of this assignment is to support further alignment with the Nitrate directive in North Macedonia and its integration into national legal systems. The main objective of this assignment is to:

- Assess the current status of transposition and implementation of Nitrate directive in North Macedonia.
- Identify gaps, challenges, and inconsistencies in legal, institutional, and operational frameworks.
- to develop a strategic recommendation on whether North Macedonia should designate specific Nitrate Vulnerable Zones (NVZs) (Art. 3(1)– (4)) or apply the action programme to the entire national territory (Art. 3(5)). If NVZ designation is selected, to support the scientific and technical process for defining NVZ boundaries based on available evidence and in accordance with Article 3 of the Directive. To support development of a legally defensible designation process, build institutional capacity, and prepare for implementation.
- Provide clear, actionable recommendations for completing and improving transposition and implementation.
- Support the development of coordinated measures, policies, and cooperation mechanisms to meet ND objectives.

C. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Under the guidance of the Outcome Manager and the Team Leader, the Expert shall carry out the following tasks:









- 1.1. Review the two implementation alternatives under Article 3 of the Directive:
 - Option A: Delineation of NVZs (targeted zoning based on monitoring and risk).
 - Option B: Application of the action programme to the whole territory.

1.2. Assess:

- Existing monitoring capacity and limitations.
- Agricultural pressures and spatial distribution.
- Administrative burden of zonal versus full-territory approach.
- Potential legal and compliance implications.
- Lessons from other EU countries.
- 1.3. Provide a written recommendation report to relevant ministries (MoEPP and MAFWE), including:
 - Comparative analysis of both options.
 - Suggested approach for North Macedonia.
 - Supporting justification referencing Article 3.
- 1.4. Facilitate a decision-making workshop involving MoEPP, MAFWE, HMS, and key stakeholders to validate and formally select the approach.

Task 2.a (Conditional) Prepare a Justification Report for NVZ Delineation Using Weight-of-Evidence Approach This section applies only if Option A (NVZ designation) is chosen.

2.1. Compile and analyse:

- Partial nitrate monitoring data from surface and groundwater.
- Agricultural pressure data: livestock density, fertilizer use, cropping intensity.
- Soil, hydrology, and aquifer vulnerability data.
- Hydrogeological maps and land topography.

2.2. Apply the scientific criteria under Article 3:

- Physical and environmental characteristics of land and waters.
- Behaviour of nitrogen compounds in soils and waters under national conditions.
- Impact of existing or planned measures under Article 5.
- 2.3. Conduct spatial analysis and GIS mapping to integrate these data layers and delineate NVZs using a risk-based, weight-of-evidence approach.
- 2.4. **Draft and justify NVZ boundaries**, including:
 - Delineation rationale,
 - Proposed monitoring points,
 - Implications for enforcement and farmer obligations.

Task 3a. (Conditional) Legal and Reporting Support (This section applies only if Option A(NVZ designation) is chosen)

3.1. Prepare a technical annex and mapping package to support the inclusion of NVZ boundaries in the forthcoming secondary legislation.

Task 2.b. (Conditional) Prepare a Justification Report for Whole Territory Approach—
This section applies only if Option B (Application of the action programme to the whole territory).

- 2.1 Develop formal justification document attached to the government's decision) that include:
 - Summary of available data and evidence: Partial monitoring results (even if incomplete); Agricultural pressure mapping; Vulnerability of soils and aquifers;
 - An explanation why targeted designation is impractical or insufficient, including but not limited to: Lack of capacity to monitor/delineate zones accurately; Risk of significant diffuse pollution throughout the country; Consistency with precautionary principles.

2.2 Develop a National Action Programme that:

- Define measures for: Fertilizer application limits; Closed period; Manure storage requirements; Buffer zones near watercourses; Describe monitoring and inspection arrangements; suggest mechanisms for farmer obligations and reporting.
- Establish provisions for review and updates.

Task 3b. Conditional) Legal and Reporting Support (This section applies only if Option B (Application of the action programme to the whole territory) is chosen.

3.1. Prepare a technical annex and mapping package to support the preparation of the

 - Decision-making process,
 - Technical criteria

Task 4. Capacity Building and Communication

- 4.1. Organize 1–2 technical consultation/training sessions for institutional staff on NVZ designation, GIS integration/ Application of the action programme to the whole territory, and implementation planning.
- 4.2. Develop a briefing note or policy summary for decision-makers.
- 4.3. Support a public consultation or information session (if deemed necessary). The expert is expected to provide a presentation summarising the key findings and recommendations from the gap assessment report and recommendations. The aim is to gather feedback and promote dialogue on implementation and reach consensus on the next steps to harmonize legislation
