About the Project

The Strengthening CSO Capacity to Scale Up Sustainable Freshwater Fisheries in Cambodia (EU-CSO) project is a 48-month Action (01 November 2023 – 31 October 2027), funded by the European Union (EU). This Action aims to enhance the capacity of civil society organizations (CSOs) in improving fisheries management in Cambodia's Tonle Sap and Mekong regions. The project is designed to safeguard nationally and regionally significant fisheries, while addressing climate change impacts and hydrological shifts caused by upstream dams and agricultural expansion.

The project is led by IUCN, in partnership with Fisheries Action Coalition Team (FACT) and Cultural and Environment Preservation Association (CEPA). It focuses on strengthening the operational and technical capacities of 15 Community Fisheries (CFis), as well as three CSOs: Village Support Group (VSG), Trailblazer Cambodia Organization (TCO), and 3S Rivers Protection Network (3SPN). The primary aim is to enhance sustainable fisheries management practices, promote multi-stakeholder knowledge exchange, and foster CSO-led research and policy dialogues on critical fisheries issues. The overall objective is to strengthen the capacity of three focal CSOs and 20 CFis to improve freshwater fisheries management in Cambodia.

The project has been designed with three key three outcomes:

- Outcome 1: The technical and operational capacity of the three focal CSOs are scaled up to improve fisheries management practices, including sustainable financing.
- Outcome 2: Accelerated knowledge sharing through facilitation of multi-stakeholder networks and peer-to-peer learning
- Outcome 3: Supported CSO research and government dialogue on key fisheries management policy issues, including financing.

Description of the Assignment

The Mid-Term Review (MTR) serves as an independent assessment of the project's progress. It is designed to evaluate the achievement of the project's objectives and identify areas for improvement. The MTR will focus on assessing the project's effectiveness, efficiency, impacts, and sustainability, and will provide actionable recommendations to refine project strategies.

The specific objectives of the MTR include:

1. Assess the relevance, effectiveness, efficiency, impact, and sustainability of the project's design and implementation.
2. Review progress against the project's logical framework, indicators, and targets.
3. Identify lessons learned and best practices to inform the second half of the project.
4. Provide actionable recommendations for improvement in project strategies, partnerships, and sustainability mechanisms.

It is suggested that the MTR adopt a mixed-methods approach, utilizing both qualitative and quantitative tools to ensure a comprehensive and evidence-based evaluation. Data collection should include document review, key informant interviews, group discussions, and field observations. In addition, the MTR should assess the project through the following criteria, with corresponding key questions to guide the evaluation:

Criterion	Key Questions
Relevance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Are the project objectives aligned with national fisheries policies and community needs? - Are the interventions addressing priority challenges faced by CSOs and CFIs?
Effectiveness	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To what extent have the project's outcomes and outputs been achieved? - How effective are the capacity-building and networking mechanisms? - What results have been observed at the community and CSO levels?
Efficiency	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Were project resources (financial, human, time) used optimally? - Are implementation and management structures effective and value for money?
Impact	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - What are the observed or potential impacts on fisheries governance, CSO capacity, and community livelihoods? - Are there examples of positive policy influence or improved local practices?
Sustainability	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - What measures ensure the long-term continuation of results (e.g., financing mechanisms, policy engagement)? - How likely are CSOs and CFIs to sustain practices after the project ends?
Lessons Learned	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - What are the key success factors and challenges observed so far? - How can future interventions improve based on current experiences?

- Demonstrated knowledge on community fisheries (CFi), community protected areas (CPA), community-based ecotourism and sustainable financing, relevant policies and networking in Cambodia.
- Proven experience in participatory monitoring, evaluation, research and report writing.
- Excellent command of English and/or Khmer, both written and spoken.
- Strong analytical, facilitation, and communication skills.
